1st ESCP Summer School "Cognitive Approaches to Memory"

Dear colleague:

Thank you for your interest in participating in the ESCP Summer School "Cognitive Approaches to Memory". We are delighted that so many have asked for application forms, and that everyone we asked to teach did accept. I take this as a good omen for the Summer School. Another of the good news is that the Volkswagen Foundation is sponsoring the ESCP Summer School. This means that, apart from a fee of DM 300.-, you will be refunded for costs of travel, accomodation, and meals (but not drinks).

The bad news is that we are limited to about forty participants (from all over Europe), so we cannot promise that everyone will get enrolled. We all agree that participants should be European scientists engaged in doctoral or immediate postdoctoral research in human memory or related fields, with a good working knowledge of English, since all proceedings will be in English. There must be many more than just 40 of those young scientists all over Europe; therefore, some selection has to be made in favour of a European balance. Please return the application form (enclosed) by February 15, 1987. The board of the ESCP will decide on your application in March, so you should receive a letter of confirmation not before April, 1987. That letter will also contain information how to reach Bernried from Munich, and abstracts and recommended reading by the lecturers.

The Summer School will take place at Bernried, a lovely place near Munich on Lake Starnberg, from June 21st to July 4th, 1987. All events will take place at Kloster Bernried, a nunnery now mainly used for conferences etc. The nunnery lies directly on the shore, with a park about three miles long. The house has modest comfort (single and double rooms, showers on the floor). Please note that participants are required to stay for the whole time. Since the Summer School will start late on Sunday, and end early on a Saturday, you may spend an additional weekend in Munich, or upper Bavaria (this is, of course, outside the scope of what we can or will arrange).

Our daily schedule starts with a lecture at 9, lasting for about an hour with another half an hour for discussion. Study time follows, lasting until lunch. The afternoon lecture starts at 1:30, to be followed by group meetings with the tutors at 4. In the evening, the hour from 7:30 on will be reserved for guest lectures, or presentations of the tutors and posters by the participants. Our preliminary programme is the following:

Although you may well be acquainted with the work of those lecturers, let me tell you about special topics: Hinton will concentrate on models of distributed storage, Jones on mathematical & probabilistic models of memory, Kintsch presumably on memory for prose, Weinert & Schneider on memory development, Wagenaar and myself on everyday & autobiographical memory. The tutorial staff will consist of Hitch (GB), Koriat (Israel), Raaijmakers (NL), Wender (D), and d'Ydewalle (B).

I feel confident that the ESCP Summer School is going to be productive and stimulating, and a memorably pleasant event for all who participate. Remember, please, that we expect your application by February 15, 1987.
