## Cognitive Aspects of Motor Behavior

will be held in Ohlstadt (FRG, Bavaria) from 18.8.1991 - 31.8.1991

The summer school offers a time of intensive study and opportunities to get in touch with people from different countries and different disciplines who work on related problems, all this a pleasant surround. The daily program includes lectures by internationally reputed scientists, tutorials, workshops, individual study time, time for informal meetings and also opportunities to discuss own research. Guest lectures will be presented by distinguished scientists. - The major lecture series will cover the following topics: (1) History of Motor Research, Kinematics and Dynamics in Biological Systems, (3) Neural Basis of Higher-level Motor Control, (4) Cognitive Setting of Automatic Modes of Motor Control, (5) Formal Approaches to Motor Control, (6) Movement and Perception, (7) Motor Planning, (8) Coordination, (9) Motor Development. Guest lectures are planned on Robotics, Brain Imaging, Movement Coding in Motor Cortex, Imagery and Movement, Cognitive Skills.

We envisage a group of 40 students from different European countries and different disciplines, mainly, but not exclusively, Psychology and Physiology. Students of the summer school should preferably pursue some own work in the field indicated by the general topic of the summer school or in a closely related area. Doctoral students and young scientists who are interested in participating should write to
